The Eleventh Circuit Court (Therapeutic Supervised Visitation); Bethany Christian Services (Respite); CHADS Coalition for Mental Health (Home-Based Family Support and Mentoring); Community Living, Inc. (Respite); Compass Health Network (PWF Parent Partner); F.A.C.T. (Educational Advocacy); Foster & Adoptive Care Coalition (30 Days to Family); Gateway Alliance against Human Trafficking (Program Specialist); Megan Meier Foundation (Counseling); The Child Advocacy Center (Advocacy and Counseling); and UMSL - Center for Behavioral Health (Psychological Assessments) were due to high demand.

A motion was made to approve a wire-transfer for \$872,800.00 for the month of November. (M.S.P.: Dobbins/Elliott) – Motion passed.

A motion was made to approve a wire-transfer for ARPA funds for \$44,420.29 the month of November. (M.S.P.: Dobbins/Schneider) – Motion passed.

All CCRB invoices and bills paid were completed with 100% accuracy.

- EMD Consultants will interview staff this week in preparation for the Executive Director search and a survey was emailed to agency partner Executive Directors. The survey deadline is January 5, 2024.
- Staff completed the Program Manager job description and shared it with the Board.
- Jeanne Spencer finalized the Zengine Portal for 2024 billing and 2023 year-end reports. Training for agencies will be held in January 2024.

 Catherine Williams seconded the nomination. Cory was willing to accept the nomination.

A motion was made to close the nominations for Vice Chair. (M.S.P.: Dobbins/Williams) – Motion passed.

A motion was made to approve Cory Elliott as Vice Chair for 2024. (M.S.P.: Dobbins/Williams) – Motion passed.

 Treasurer - Nancy Schneider nominated Ken Dobbins for the position of Treasurer for 2024. Catherine Williams seconded the nomination. Ken was willing to accept the nomination.

A motion was made to close the nominations for Vice Chair. (M.S.P.: Williams/Elliott) – Motion passed.

A motion was made to approve Ken Dobbins as Treasurer for 2024. (M.S.P.: Schneider/Williams) – Motion passed.

Approval of 2024-2025 Funding for Existing Programs: Bruce reported the Board subcommittees met to review 60 application summaries for the 2024-2025 funding requests. Each subcommittee created a list of recommendations, and these were distributed to the full Board for review. Staff recommended the Board approve the subcommittee recommendations as presented. See the Appendix for detailed list of approved funds for 2024-2025 existing programs.

A motion was made to approve \$24,869,280.21 for 2024-2025 existing program funding, as presented. (M.S.P.: Dobbins/Williams) – Motion passed.

Approval of 2024 Funding for New Programming: The CCRB received 9 new program applications for 2024. The Boad reviewed and scored each application. The following agencies submitted requests to be considered for approval.

- International Crisis Aid D.B.A. Crisis Aid International requested funding for their crisis intervention program as follows:
 - 94 units of Advocacy at a rate of \$53.19 per hour; 372 units of Case Management at a rate of \$53.45 per hour; 100 units of Crisis Interventions at a rate of \$50.00 per hour; 200 units of Mentoring at a rate of \$50.00 per hour; and 67 units of Presentations at a rate of \$134.33 per hour, totaling \$48,883.37.

A motion was made to approve Crisis Aid International's crisis intervention request of \$48,883.37 as presented. (M.S.P.: Schneider/Dobbins) – Motion passed.

- Kids In The Middle requested funding for their counseling as follows:
 - 160 units of Case Management at a rate of \$61.24 per hour; 1,200 units of Counseling Group at a rate of \$44.13 per hour; 125 units of Counseling Individual at a rate of \$90.00 per hour; and 10 units of School-Based Support at a rate of \$75.00 per hour, totaling \$74,754.40.

A motion was made to approve Kids In The Middle's counseling request of \$74,754.40 as presented. (M.S.P.: Elliott/Cunningham) – Motion passed.

- Megan Meier Foundation requested funding their home and community-based program as follows:
 - o 250 units of Case Management at a rate of \$103.76 per hour, totaling \$25,940.00.

A motion was made to approve Megan Meier Foundation's home and community-based request of \$25,940.00 as presented. (M.S.P.: Elliott/Cunningham) – Motion passed.

- Partners In-Kind requested funding for their counseling programs as follows:
 - o 30 units of Case Management at a rate of \$89.91 per hour; and 1,320 units of Psychological Assessments at a rate of \$154.11 per hour, totaling \$206,122.50.

A motion was made to approve Partners In-Kind's counseling request of \$206,122.50 as presented. (M.S.P.: Marty/Schneider) – Motion passed.

- Chestnut Health Systems Inc. requested funding for their counseling programs as follows:
 - o 160 units of Assessments at a rate of \$179.52 per hour; 120 units of Case Management at a rate of \$79.57 per hour; and 960 units of Counseling Student at a rate of \$159.24 per hour, totaling \$191,142.00.

A motion was made to approve Chestnut Health Systems counseling request of \$191,142.00 as presented. (M.S.P.: Schaberg/Marty) – Motion passed.

- Community Living, Inc. requested funding for their home and community-based program as follows:
 - o 3,150 units of Center-Based-SOAR Jr. at a rate of \$27.56 per hour, totaling \$86,814.00.

A motion was made to approve Community Living, Inc.'s home and community-based request of \$86,814.00. (M.S.P.: Schneider/Williams) – Motion passed.

- Child Day Care Association D.B.A. United 4 Children requested funding for their home and community-based program as follows:
 - o 600 units of Early Childhood at a rate of \$500.00 per 2 hours, and 30 units of Presentations at a rate of \$750.00 per presentation, totaling \$322,500.00.

A motion was made to approve United 4 Children's home and community-based request of \$322,500.00, as presented. (M.S.: Marty/Schaberg) – Motion did not have enough votes for approval.

- Empowering Youth and Communities Inc. D.B.A. EYC Academy requested funding for their home and community-based program as follows:
 - o 50 units of school-based at a rate of \$3,050.00 of services per semester, totaling \$152,500.00.

A motion was entertained; the Board did not make a motion to approve.

- Hanani House requested funding for their transitional living program as follows:
 - 208 units of Family Therapy at a rate of \$60.00 per hour; 208 units of Group Counseling at a rate of \$12.96 per hour; 104 units of Mothers and Children counseling at a rate of \$41.80 hour, and 24 units of Transitional Living at a rate of \$600 per day for a total of \$33,922.88.

A motion was entertained; the Board did not make a motion to approve.

Approval of 2024 Administrative Budget: Bruce provided detailed explanation for each of the items listed in the 2024 Administrative Budget. He included rationale for each category where an increase occurred, including \$18,000.00 for the CCRB annual audit due to changing auditing firms; health insurance increased by 11% to \$64,200.00; benefits and retirement remains at 6% of salaries; consulting contract of \$35,040.00 to BOLD, Inc. for an updated Community Impact Report and Needs Assessment; \$25,000.00 to ASPEN Network for the expansion of assessment and referral services; and \$15,000.00 to Cheri Thurman for continued support of the System of Care. The CCRB will continue to abide with current contracts with Avatara, WizeHive, and EMD. The recommended Administrative Budget is just about 5% of the services budget.

A motion was made to approve \$669,750.00 for the 2024 Administrative Budget, as presented. (M.S.P.: Dobbins/Elliott) – Motion passed.

Approval of the 2024 Budget: The 2024 CCRB Services Budget was discussed. Bruce reported that he and the Finance Committee met and discussed the 2024 budget. Bruce provided Board members with a report on the proposed services budget. The recommended 2024 Services Budget is \$14,508,944.90.

A motion was made to approve \$14,508,944.90 for the 2024 Services Budget. (M.S.P.: Schneider/Marty) – Motion passed.

- Dianne Mueller, Saint Louis Crisis Nursery, announced the Giving Vending Machine located at West County Mall starting Wednesday, December 20, 2023. The machine will allow shoppers to purchase items needed at the nursery, such as diapers, wipes, and clothing.
- Kathy Thompson, LINC St. Charles County, announced the Emergency Weather Response Network activation starting tonight, Monday, December 18, 2023.
