## Mental Health and Substance Use Treatment Services Available for Children and Their Families in St. Charles County

The COVID-19 pandemic has potentially impacted almost every aspect of children's lives: development, learning, behavior, their families' economic security, protection from violence and abuse, and physical and mental health.

Mental health resources and substance use treatment services continue to be available for children and their families. Services are available at no-cost for St. Charles County residents, regardless of income or insurance status. "All of our direct service providers have adapted how they provide services given this pandemic," explained Bruce Sowatsky, Executive Director of the Community and Children's Resource Board, "Many agencies now provide mental health services virtually. If your family needs help related to this crisis or otherwise, they are ready to serve you safely and compassionately. Please reach out."

In addition to its responsibilities of administering funds, the CCRB also oversees local funding for the Missouri Children's Trust Fund License Plate Program.
