## **New Year Brings Change to the CCRB**

We hope your year is starting off well and that you found some time for self-care and reflection during the busy holiday season and end of year demands. The new year is generally a time of planning and anticipation, and we are facing extensive growth and change at the CCRB in 2023. We will embrace the opportunity to turn these changes into chances!

- In December, the Board approved funding for 11 new programs, which includes 4 new agency partners. We are excited to welcome them to the CCRB family and these programs will provide services to more St. Charles County youth.
- A second round of American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA) funds will be opened to youth mental health and substance use treatment providers.
- We look forward to utilizing our expanded office space, which includes a new office, conference room, and storage.
- Michelle McElfresh (Director of Contracts and Compliance) and Jeanne Spencer

(Program Specialist) are hard at work restructuring the grant management process with an emphasis on building more personal relationships with our agency partners and in the community.

- Implementation of a custom grant management system will begin in late January.
   We look forward to a more efficient data processing system for data collection, reporting, and applications. The new system is expected to roll out by May.
- Bruce is preparing for Strategic Planning in the spring, which will enhance our succession plan, agency mission, and set goals for 2023-2025. He continues to manage the fiscal responsibilities of the Children's Services Fund and ARPA Funds while building upon the many relationships that make our community thrive.
- The CCRB's 2022 revenues were 7.5% higher than 2021, allowing for greater investment in youth mental health and substance use services through supplemental funding opportunities and program expansions.

- False: Human trafficking does not occur in the United States.
- False: Human Trafficking is always or usually a violent crime.
- False: Only undocumented foreign nationals get trafficked in the United States.
- False: Immigrants are causing human trafficking in the U.S.
- False: Human trafficking only happens in illegal or underground industries.
- False: All human trafficking involves commercial sex.

The response provides emergency shelter services to anyone needing a safe place to sleep during nights with extreme cold temperatures. #### **Parent Education Services**

Classes are specifically designed to address emotional, behavioral, and relational difficulties

caused by early trauma in an honest environment that supports and encourages. The focus is not on controlling behaviors, but partnering with parents to understand their children and help improve the quality of their family life. Parent education services are provided by Developmental Trauma Center instructors, specifically trained in the Neurosequential Model of Therapeutics (NMT).

**More than childcare.** The Sparrow's Nest childcare program offers free, Christ-centered childcare to families from Monday to Friday in exchange for one full day of participation in our program. During this day, parents will have weekly individualized case

management sessions with our program manager, receive hands-on parenting education from our childcare providers, and be connected to any additional resources they may need. Outside of their day at the Nest, parents are required to work at least 25 hours a week or enroll in an educational program.
