## What's Happening at the CCRB?

### Caution: Hard Work Ahead!

During the lull of February, the CCRB staff dedicated time to planning for 2024 and how we can maximize funding impact in the community. Here are a few of the things we have been up to at the CCRB:

- Comprehensive planning meetings to evaluate our projects and tasks in 2024. We
  developed plans and deadlines for each one. Our team of 4 has a lot to do this
  year!
- Trained funding partners in 2024 billing and reporting processes using our new application portal.
- Met with new agency partners to review the CCRB contract, discuss our grant management processeses, and to answer any questions or address concerns they may have about being a CCRB agency partner.

- Mindreach and the CCRB website were updated to reflect our new services. We are

working on marketing materials to share.

- Attended a community meeting to discuss potential counseling and social work career path development. We look forward to supporting this effort as community members brainstorm ways to address staff shortages in the social work and counselor professions.
- Agency parnters will submit their annual clinical outcomes reports for each program. These goals help us measure the impact on kids under 19 years, professionals who serve youth, and families with children.

## CCRB Services Spotlight



#### Outpatient Substance Use Treatment

A client-centered and strengths-based approach which includes therapies and relapse-prevention programs, such as counseling, psychiatry, and case management. *93% of St. Charles County youth had reduced chemical/substance usage at discharge.* 

#### Team of Concern

School and community-based substance use prevention programing, which includes professional development training, presentations, small groups, crisis intervention, individual services, and linkage to referrals. 92% of St. Charles County youth developed risk management skills to avoid engaging in risky behaviors.

## What is Self-Love & Why is it So Important?



## Underage Drinking Statistics

#### **Many Youth Drink Alcohol**

In 2022, according to the National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH), about 19.7% of youth ages 14 to 15 reported having at least 1 drink in their lifetime.1

In 2022, 5.9 million youth ages 12 to 20 reported drinking alcohol beyond "just a few sips" in the past month.2

Adolescent alcohol use differs by race and ethnicity. For example, at age 14, White, Black, and Hispanic youth are equally likely to drink. By age 18, White and Hispanic youth are twice as likely to drink than Black youth.3

## Family-to-Family Mental Health Education

NAMI St. Louis offers FREE mental health education classes for families called Family-to-Family (F2F) and they have two classes that will start soon.

**NAMI Family-to-Family** is a free, 8-session educational program for family, significant others and friends of people with mental health conditions. It is a designated evidencedbased program. This means that research shows that the program significantly improves the coping and problem-solving abilities of the people closest to a person with a mental health condition. NAMI Family-to-Family is taught by NAMI-trained family members who have been there, and includes presentations, discussions and interactive exercises. ## DiAnne Mueller Celebrates 30-Year Career as Crisis Nursery CEO



Mueller's Term was Marked by Expansion of Programs and Services

The Saint Louis Crisis Nursery, a national leader in the prevention of child abuse and neglect, announced today that, after 30 years of dedicated, dynamic leadership and passionate advocacy for children and families, CEO DiAnne Mueller, MS LPC, will conclude her illustrious chapter of service at the Crisis Nursery in March.

Under Ms. Mueller's stewardship, the Crisis Nursery has become one of the premier resources for families in crisis in the greater St. Louis region and beyond. Since being appointed CEO in 1994, Ms. Mueller has been the guiding force in expanding the Crisis Nursery's footprint, scope, and

capacity to serve thousands of children and families.

Under her leadership, the organization grew from two 24-hour Nursery locations to five and established 11 Crisis Nursery Family Empowerment Centers in at-risk communities. In addition, the Crisis Nursery launched an innovative Latinx Outreach Program, a Trauma Informed Art & Play Therapy program, a DEI-B team, and a Holiday Hearts community support program. The organization also started four additional Boards, offered services for the unhoused, created a Rent and Utilities Emergency Fund Request Program, a Transportation Fund, and began an innovative Compassionate Care Program.

Ms. Mueller said: "I am most grateful for my incredible staff: our Leadership and Administrative Teams, the Front-line staff that cares for our kids 24/7, and the Family Empowerment staff and Latinx Team who go into the community to meet families in their homes. What I will miss most is holding babies, playing with our kids, and meeting with the mothers who have graduated from our program and are now members of our Parent Advisory Board."

Ms. Mueller continued, "The Crisis Nursery is the strongest it has ever been. The reputation of our life-saving child abuse prevention agency is synonymous with the values that have guided our mission. I am so humbled and proud of what our Crisis Nursery Leadership Team has been able to achieve, and I am confident about our future."
